Her monologue about a Ugandan grandmother, *Lifelines*, has been performed at fundraising events by Ruby Dee, Allison Janney and Liv Ullman.

The monologue, Mother to Son is published in Eve Ensler's anthology A Memory, A Monologue, A Rant and A Prayer, (Random House) and in the anthology Best Women's Monologues of The Millennium (Applause). Mother... continues to tour cities across the U.S. with the photo exhibit, Darfur/Darfur and the documentary The Devil Came on Horseback and at rallies for Darfur.
